Safeguards

Please read the following safeguards for your TV and retain for future reference. Always follow all warnings and instructions marked on the television.

1. A note about safety and operating instructions

Read and follow all safety and operating instructions, and retain them safely for future reference.

2. Heed Warnings

Adhere to all warnings on the appliance and in the operating instructions.

3. Cleaning

Unplug the TV from the wall outlet before cleaning. Do not use liquid, abrasive, or aerosol cleaners. Cleaners can permanently damage the cabinet and screen. Use a lightly dampened cloth for cleaning.

4. Wall Bracket

Wall brackets are not supplied with this product. After market brackets may be available to purchase locally. Please refer to the specification page for dimensions.

5. Water and Moisture

Avoid dripping or splashing of liquids onto the product. Objects filled with liquids, such as vases, should not be placed on the product.

6. Setting

Do not place this TV on an unstable cart, stand or table. Placing the TV on an unstable base can cause the TV to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the TV. Use only a cart, stand, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or salesperson.

7. Ventilation

Slots and openings in the cabinet are provided for ventilation, to ensure reliable operation of the TV and to protect it from overheating. Do not cover the ventilation openings in the cabinet and never place the set in a confined space such as built-in cabinet unless proper ventilation is provided. Leave a minimum 10cm gap all around the unit.

8. Power Source

This TV should be operated only from the type of power source indicated on the marking label. If you are not sure of the type of power supplied to your home, consult your appliance dealer or local power company.

9. Power-Cord Protection

Power- supply cords should be routed so that they are not likely to be walked on or pinched by items placed upon or against them, paying particular attention to cords at plug, wall outlets, and the point where they exit from the TV. MAIN plug is used as the disconnect device, the disconnect device shall remain readily operable.

10. Lightning

For added protection for this TV during a lightning storm, or when it is left unattended and unused for long periods of time, unplug it from the wall outlet and disconnect the antenna or cable system. This will prevent damage to the TV due to lightning or power-line surge.

Important Safety Precautions

11. Power Lines

An outside antenna system should not be located in the vicinity of overhead power lines or other electric light or power circuits, or where it can fall into such power lines or circuits. Where installing an outside antenna system, extreme care should be taken to keep from touching such power lines or circuits as contact with them might be fatal.

12. Overloading

Do not overload wall outlets and extension cords as this can result in a risk of fire or electric shock.

13. Object and Liquid Entry

Never push objects of any kind into this TV through openings as they may touch dangerous voltage points or short-out parts that could result in fire or electric shock. Never spill liquid of any kind on or into the TV.

14. Outdoor Antenna Grounding

If an outside antenna or cable system is connected to the TV, be sure the antenna or cable system is grounded so as to provide some protection against voltage surges and built-up static charges.

15. Servicing

Do not attempt to service this TV yourself as opening or removing covers may expose you to dangerous voltage or other hazards. Refer all servicing to qualified service personnel.

16. Damage Requiring Service

Unplug the TV from the wall outlet and refer servicing to qualified service personnel under the following conditions:

- (a) When the power supply cord or plug is damaged.
- (b) If liquid has been spilled, or objects have fallen into the TV.
- (c) If the TV has been exposed to rain or water.
- (d) If the TV does not operate normally by following the operating instructions. Adjust only those controls that are covered by the operating instructions as an improper adjustment of other controls may result in damage and will often require extensive work by a qualified technician to restore the TV to its normal operation.
- (e) If the TV has been dropped or the cabinet has been damaged.
- (f) When the TV exhibits a distinct change in performance this indicates a need for service.

17. Replacement Parts

When replacement parts are required, be sure the service technician has used replacement parts specified by the manufacturer or have the same characteristics as the original part. Unauthorized substitutions may result in fire, electric shock or other hazards.

18. Safety Check

Upon completion of any service or repair to the TV, ask the service technician to perform safety checks to determine that the TV is in safe operating condition.

19. Heat

The product should be situated away from heat sources such as radiators, heat registers, stoves, or other products (including amplifiers) that produce heat.

Channel Scan

Settings > Channel

- Tuner Mode: Select if you receive TV channels over the air(antenna) or through a cable set top box as the input will be used during a channel scan.
- Auto Scan: Automatically scan for channels to view programming from your TV source.
- DTV Manual Scan: Manually scan for DTV channels to view programming from your TV source.
- ATV Manual Scan: Manually scan for ATV channels to view programming from your TV source.
- ATV Fine Tuning: Fine tuning current channel to improve the programme picture.

Channel Edit

Settings > Channel > Channel Edit

Manually edit the channel list to your preference.

- Edit the channels
 - Rename: Press [GREEN] button, to rename the selected channel.
- Edit the favorite channels

You can add favorite channels or move/remove favorite channels.

Channel List

Display the channel list

In Live TV, press 💿 or 🚭 button on the remote control to display the Channel List menu.

- Displays the channels that have been automatically searched.
- 2. Edit

Edit the channel list.

Favorite

Viewing your 'Favorites' list

Press e or o button to call out the Channel list, the channel list appears on the right side of the screen, a heart-shaped icon will appear next to your favorite channel.

Edit the favorite list

There are 2 ways to enter the edit menu :

- Adding channels to a Favorites list Select the Add channels to add the selected channel to the favorite list.
- Moving channels from a favorites list
 Select channels in a favorites list, press
 button to move the selected channel.
- Removing channels from Favorites list
 Select channels in a favorites list, press button to remove the selected channel.

► NOTES

- These steps should be operated under TV inputs.
- Before you edit the fav lists, complete channel scan first.
- You can add channels from various reception types to the FAV list.

EPG

It provides convenience to check TV programs that will be available in the next 7 days. The information displayed by the Guide is made available by the commercial television networks for digital channels only. The Guide also provides a simple way to record your favorite programs and a reminder function which can switch channel automatically at scheduled time so that you will not miss programs of interest. (The availability and amount of programme information will vary, depending on the particular broadcaster).

- Press the
 button on the remote control to display channel information on program guide list. Or
 press the
 or
 or
 >Menu > EPG.
- Watch
 - When a current program is selected, press the or button to switch to the channel you want to see.
- Page Up/Down
 - Press the CH+/CH- buttons to move programme list page up/down.
- Schedule

Press the **[RED]** button to view a list of scheduled reminders and recordings.

• 24h-

Press the [YELLOW] button to select the yesterday programmes.

• 24h+

Press the **[BLUE]** button to select the next day programmes.

• PVR/Reminder

Press \land / \checkmark button to select the channels. Press \lt / \triangleright button to select program based on the time schedule.

Press 🐼 button on the remote control to select PVR or Reminder.

- ► NOTES
- PVR/Reminder in the EPG is only available for programmes that haven't been aired yet.
- A storage device (space should be no less than 2G, transfer rate should be no less than 5MB/s) must be attached to the television for recording purposes.
- The TV will record the program even in standby mode.

PVR

The PVR function allows you to easily record digital television content for later viewing. The function is only available in DTV source only. The format of the storage disk must be either FAT32 or NTFS. The PVR will not function if a data storage device has not been connected.

• Schedule Recording

Press
button, Select the program to be played, press
button to set the appointment time and period, the reservation is successful. Press
[RED] button to view the scheduled recording. In schedule recording list, you can readjust the reservation information that has been set.

• Instant Recording

- 1. Press 🕑 button to select PVR.
- 2. Select the partition, and the HDD speed will be tested(appear when using for the first time).
- 3. You can choose to manually stop or automatically match the program time.
- Standby record

If you press the power button during recording, TV will go into standby mode but the recording process is still going on. If you press power button again and wake up the TV, recording process will not be affected. After recording, the recorded file will be automatically saved to the disk.

► NOTES

- Hard disk that is no more than 8T is recommended to use.
- If you want to store the video streaming of a DTV program, the transfer rate of the hard disk must not be less than 5MB/s.
- The PVR function doesn't support analogue channels.
- The schedule recording function is not available while you are watching a programme that is currently being broadcast.

Accessing the recording list

See the list of recorded programs and scheduled recordings. To enter the recording list :

Managing the recording list

▼ > Recording List > Recorded

You can watch or delete recorded programs.

• Delete the recorded program

Select Edit and then select recorded program in recording list, press S button to remove the recorded program.

• Watch

Select recorded program in recording list, press 🐼 button to watch the recorded program.

Managing the schedule recording list

▼ > Recording List > Scheduled

You can change scheduled recording information or cancel scheduled recordings.

• Delete the scheduled program

Select Edit and then select scheduled program in schedule list, press > button to remove the scheduled program.

• Edit scheduled program

Select scheduled program in schedule list, press or button to adjust the scheduled program.

Timeshift

This option allows you to pause and rewind live TV. This function operates by recording temporarily to a storage device. Please ensure your storage device is connected and there is enough free disk space. Otherwise the recording will not commence.

Press v button on the remote control to select T.Shift and then the menu will appear, press i button to pause the live broadcast and press button to play. Press v button to watch reverse and press button to watch advance playback rapidly. Press v button to exit the function and watch the current broadcast.

► NOTES

- The T.Shift function doesn't support analogue channels.
- The storage space of the USB device should be no less than 1G.

Ethernet

Connecting to the Internet

NOTES

- 1. You get access to the Internet through your TV.
- We recommend to use a modem or router that supports Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol(DHCP). Modems and routers that support DHCP automatically provide the IP address, netmask, gateway, and DNS, so you don't have to enter them manually. Most home networks already have DHCP.



Connecting to a Wired (Ethernet) Network

Settings > Network > Network Configuration

You set the TV network by selecting Configuration and press 🐼 button to enter the submenu.

• Connection Type

Choose a wired network connection to access the Internet.

- Ethernet Display the network status.
- IP Settings

Configure the IP setting for your network connection.

Wireless

Connecting to the Internet

► NOTES

- You get access to the Internet through your TV.
- Connect to an available wireless network.
- Make sure that you have the wireless router's SSID and password before attempting to connect.

Connecting to a Wireless Network

> Settings > Network > Network Configuration

You set the TV network by selecting Configuration and press the or button to enter the submenu.

Connection Type

Choose a wireless network connection to access the Internet.

 - Configure the advanced wireless network settings for the TV.
- Add You can add wireless network.
- Refresh Refresh wireless network.

► NOTES

- If no wireless router is found, select Add and enter the network name in the SSID.
- If no wireless router is found, select Refresh.

HDMI&CEC

Use the TV's remote control to control external devices that are connected to the TV by an HDMI cable. The external devices need to support HDMI & CEC Function (HDMI-CEC).

Connecting an external device through HDMI & CEC Functions

Settings > System > HDMI & CEC Functions

- 1. Set CEC Control to On.
- 2. Connect an HDMI-CEC-compliant device to the TV.
- 3. Turn on the connected external device. The device is automatically connected to the TV. After connection is finished, you can access the menu of the connected device on your TV screen using your TV remote and control the device.

► NOTES

- HDMI cables must be used to connect HDMI CEC-compatible devices to your TV.
- The HDMI CEC feature of the connected device must be turned on.
- If you connect an HDMI device that is not HDMI CEC-compatible, all the HDMI-CEC control features do not work.
- Depending on the connected HDMI device, the HDMI-CEC Control feature may not work.

Connect an HDMI cable from an external digital audio system.

ARC enables the TV to directly output the digital sound through an HDMI cable. Please note that it works

only when the TV is connected to the audio receiver that supports the ARC (Audio Return Channel) function.

When this port is used as the ARC function, it can't be used as signal input at the same time.



Connect an HDMI cable from an external A/V equipment.

Some devices such as DVD player require HDMI signal to be set to output in the device's settings. Please consult your device user manual for instructions.

Please note that the HDMI connector provides both video and audio signals, it's not necessary to connect an audio cable.



Connect the USB devices such as hard drives, USB sticks and digital cameras for browsing photos, listening to music, watching videos.



- 1. Support the U disk 4G, 8G, 16G, 32G, 64G, 128G and other common market size, 8T hard drive is currently supported.
- 2. Support format: NTFS, FAT32, EXT4.

Anyview Cast

Mirror content from your Android device to the TV.

 Wait for the connection progress to complete and select content you want to share.

- TV and your Android/ios/PC device need to connect to the same network.
- Some devices may not support contents sharing function. If your device doesn't support contents sharing, you can download an app that supports the function.

Adjust current picture mode to apply to all sources or just current source.

- Brightness Adjust the Brightness level to generate lighter or darker images.
- Contrast
 Adjust the Contrast level to increase or decrease how bright images appear.
- Colour
 - Adjust the colour intensity of the picture for a more vibrant image.
- Backlight

Set the overall brightness of the screen.

• Advanced Picture Settings

Adjust advanced picture settings based on your viewing preference.

• Overscan

Change the video size settings to slightly crop the edges of the displayed image. (This function is only applicable in some countries)

• Tint

Adjust the colours from a green to magenta tint to view the natural skin tones of people on the screen.

• Sharpness

Adjust how sharp or soft edges of images appear.

• Active Contrast

Automatically darken dark areas and lighten light areas of images to see more details.

Colour Temperature

Adjust how warm(red) or cool(blue) the white areas of an image appears.

• Low Blue Light (Only for some models)

Eyes care: reduce the emission of blue light.

• Noise Reduction

Improve how clear the picture appears by reducing noise.

• Expert Settings

Adjust the colour space and Gamma to best suit the content you're viewing.

White Balance

Adjust the intensity of red, green and blue lights to view the true colours of all images in the picture.

Black Level

Adjust the HDMI signal range to be more suitable for the content.

Gamma Adjustment

Adjust the Gamma to alter how the TV will respond to the grayscale content. In a dark room choose a Higher number like 2.2. In a brighter area select a lower number like 2.0. In general, 2.4 is normally recommended.

- RGB Only Mode
 View images based on default settings or choose the colour red, blue or green.
- Restore Current Picture Mode Settings

Restore all the picture settings in the current picture mode to the factory default values.

Total Surround[™]

Provides surround sound experience by utilizing psychoacoustic processing to place sounds beside, behind and above the viewer. For best results use with Total Sonics.

• Speakers

Select the speakers which you want to use.

• TV Speaker

Disable TV speaker when you are using sound bar, ARC or any other external audio amplifier.

• Lip Sync

Synchronize the displayed image with the audio output.

Select the digital audio output format that best suits the audio device type. Select the RAW / PCM / Dolby Digital.

• Digital Audio Delay

Adjust the digital audio output delay time to sync sound from an external speaker with the images on the TV.

Adjust the left and right speaker strength to optimize audio for a specific location.

Boost the volume at different frequencies.

Restore all of the audio settings in current audio mode to the factory default values.

Set time



Set the current time based on your location.

• Time Mode

Set the date and time to automatically sync with internet/broadcast or manual setup by yourself.

- Date/Time Set the Date and Time. (Only when Time Mode is Manual can be adjusted)

Using the timers

Settings > System > Timer Settings

Adjust the timer settings to suit your preference.

• Sleep Timer

Set the sleep timer to automatically turn the TV Off within a specified time: Off, 10 Minutes, 20 Minutes, 30 Minutes, 40 Minutes, 50 Minutes, 60 Minutes, 90 Minutes and 120 Minutes.

• Power On Timer

Set the clock for the time you want the TV to turn on automatically. You can set the time only once or set the time in specified date by weekly.

• Power Off Timer

Set the clock for the time you want the TV to turn off automatically. You can set the time only once or set the time in specified date by weekly.

• Menu Timeout

Set the amount of time that you'd like for the menu to display: Off, 10s, 20s, 30s, 60s.

Notifications



Allow pop-up notifications to appear for useful information and events that occur with your TV. You can enable / disable these notifications.

- Upgrade from USB

Upgrade TV software from USB device.

► NOTES

- Please ensure the USB flash drive insert to USB2.0 port of the TV.
- The updating files must be available in root directory.
- The format of the USB must be FAT32 and the partition table type must be MBR.
- The use of the software downloaded through websites and servers is done at your own discretion and risk and with agreement that you will be solely responsible for any damage to your television system or loss of data that results from such activities.
- Warranty excludes defects or damage resulting from improper installation, repair, testing, maintenance, or adjustment done by anyone other than a duly authorized service technician.

Picture Problem

The problem	Possible Solutions
Screen Brightness	 If the colours on your TV are correct but just a little too dark or bright, try adjusting the following settings first: Select > Settings > Picture Adjust the Brightness, Contrast, Colour, or Backlight settings.
No picture, or black and white picture.	 Unplug TV from AC outlet and re-plug after 60 seconds. Check that the Colour is set to 50 or higher. Try different TV channels.
The picture is distorted.	 The compression of video content may cause picture distortions, especially in fast moving pictures from sports programmes and action movies. If the signal reception is weak or poor, screen distortion may be visible but it is not a malfunction. Mobile phones used close to the TV (within 1 m) may cause noise on analogue and digital channels.

When the TV has trouble with the picture, these steps may help resolve the problem.

Sound Problem

When the TV has difficulties with sound, these steps may help resolve the problem.

The problem	Possible Solutions
There is no sound or the sound is too low at maximum volume.	Check the volume control of the device (cable or satellite box, DVD, Blu- ray, etc.) connected to your TV.
Picture is normal, but no sound.	Check the following settings: • Check the volume settings. • Check if 'Mute' mode is set to on.
No picture, or black and white picture.	 An electrical appliance may affect TV set. Turn off appliances, if interference still goes on, move appliance farther away from TV. Insert the power plug of the TV set into another power outlet.
The speakers are making an odd sound.	 Make sure that the audio cable is connected to the correct audio output connector on the external device. For antenna or cable connections, check the signal information. A low signal level may cause sound distortions.

Picture and Sound Problem

When the TV has difficulties with sound and picture, these steps may help resolve the problem.

The problem	Possible Solutions
No sound and picture.	 Check if the power cord is plugged into a powered AC outlet. Press the 🕖 button in the remote control to activate the unit from Standby.

TroubleShooting

	 Check to see if the LED light is on or not. If it is, then the TV is receiving power.
I have connected an external source to my TV but I get no picture and/or sound.	 Check the correct connection on the external source and the input connection on the TV. Make sure you have made the correct selection for the input mode for the incoming signal.
Sound and picture distorted or appear wavy.	 Some electrical appliances may affect TV set. If you turn off the appliance and the interference goes away, then move it further away from TV. Insert the power plug of the TV set into another power outlet.
Sound and picture is blurry or cuts out momentarily.	 If you use an external antenna, check the direction, position and connection of the antenna. Adjust the direction of your antenna or reset or fine tune the channel.

Internet Problem

When the TV has difficulties connecting to the Internet, these steps may help resolve the problem.

The problem	Possible Solutions
The TV cannot connect to your network or apps.	Make sure the TV has a network connection . • Run Connection Test () > Settings > Network > Connection Test) . • Contact your Internet service provider.
The wireless network connection failed.	Make sure your wireless modem/router is on and connected to the Internet.
The wireless network signal is too weak.	Position your wireless router, modem router, or access point in a central location. Avoid putting it in a corner.

Recording/Timeshift Function Isn't Working

When Timeshift or Schedule recording aren't working, these steps may help resolve the problem.

The problem	Possible Solutions
Schedule Recording cannot be used.	 Check if there is a USB device connected to the TV. Recording will automatically stop if the signal becomes too weak. Check the free space on the USB device. The function will not work if there isn't enough storage space on the USB device.

My File Won't Play

When files aren't playing, this may help resolve the problem.

The problem	Possible Solutions
Some files can't be played.	This problem may occur with high-bitrate files. Most files can be played back, but you might experience problems with high-bitrate files.

Other Issues

Use these procedures to resolve other issues that may occur.

The problem	Possible Solutions
The TV is hot.	Watching TV for an extended period of time causes the panel to generate heat. The heat from the panel is dissipated through internal vents running along the top of the TV. However, after extended use, you may feel hot when touch it . This heat, however, is not a defect and does not affect the TV's functionality.
The TV smells of plastic.	This smell is normal and will dissipate over time.
The plastic cabinet makes a "clicking" type of sound.	The "click" sound can be caused when the temperature of the television changes. This change causes the television cabinet to expand or contract, which makes the sound. This is normal and the TV is OK.
